### **Student Reports**

This year, all teachers across the school have been implementing the new English and Maths curriculum. Reporting student learning progress to parents may include references to terminology that students and teachers have been using at school, but this terminology may not be familiar to you. There will be a glossary provided to all K-2 parents to assist with developing a shared understanding of some curriculum-related language.

Reports for students in Year 1-6 will show a grade (A-E) for their achievement in target content areas, called 'Areas of Learning', for each KLA (subject). These are not all the content areas for the KLA but just a sample of what has been taught and assessed this semester. The 'Overall Achievement' grade will be a reflection of your child's learning across all the content areas, not just those in the report. If you feel there is a discrepancy between these grades, that may be why.






