

Attendance Update

Well done to Year 5 for achieving the highest attendance rate this term - 95.22%. Year 4 also did well with the second highest rate - 94.32%. As you can see from the graph below, all our grades are above the department benchmark of 85%, shown by the red dotted line.

What is even more impressive is our own school attendance data from this year compared to last year. Our whole school attendance rate for Term 2 is currently 94%, compared to 90% for Term 2 in 2024. In addition, 92% of students have an attendance rate of 90% or more, compared to 68% for the same time last year. This is a sign of incredible commitment from our students and families to attend school regularly. Well done Mt Riv on such significant improvement!!!



NAIDOC Day at Blaxland High School




Overdue Books
